

The types of waste produced by medical institutes vary greatly according to what work they carry out. Some of these wastes are hazardous. Specific regulations have been drawn up stipulating how such waste must be managed to keep humans and the environment safe. These must be complied with at all times. To be able to do this, the different materials must be classified correctly.

This not only applies to healthcare waste and waste containing photographic chemicals and solvents. It also covers hazardous materials from research institutes, large medical appliances and safety cabinets used by laboratories as well as non-medical waste.

Our next task is to draw up a bespoke waste management concept for your business that is based on the types and volumes of waste you produce. We then provide you with suitable bins and containers for storing your waste materials and arrange with you how often they should be collected and exchanged for empty bins. Koch Institute (RKI).








Amalgam container, round, 1 litre a secure storage container for empty amalgam capsules



Amalgam container, round, 6 litres for residue from amalgam separators and filters / filters from suction units



RESHARP sharps bin, round, 2.1 litres for storing sharps in the rooms at doctors' surgeries; a variety of sizes and shapes are available



Jerry can, UN-approved, 5/10/20/30 litres for fixing baths, developing baths and solvents



Medical waste containers without UN approval, rectangular, 30/50/60 litres for storing nonhazardous medical waste



Medical waste containers with UN approval, rectangular, 30/50/60 litres for storing infectious waste, pathological waste and cytostatic medicines



Medical waste container, round, 30 litres for hazardous and nonhazardous material, e.g. medical waste / small volumes of waste



RE-BOX container system, 50 litres for storing medical waste, includes the RE-BOX bins, RE-BAG plastic sacks and RE-KICK stainless steel frame



Drums with lock rings, UN-approved, 30/60/120/220 litres for storing medical waste and small volumes of hazardous waste


We also serve businesses that have networks of laboratories across the country A raft of statutory regulations and stringent safety requirements have been drawn up for transporting healthcare waste, in particular hazardous waste. High risk materials, such as infectious waste, medical gases and lithium batteries may only be handled in accordance with the European regulations concerning the international transport of dangerous goods by road (ADR). We guarantee that your waste is handled in compliance with the ADR across all stages of the logistics chain. Our employees have received ADR training — and our 110 dedicated vehicles have all been equipped in line with the law.

- The trucks we use for transporting hazardous healthcare waste have hydraulic tail lifts, digital weighing equipment and refrigeration systems
- We use tankers to collect waste photographic chemicals
- If we need to collect waste photographic chemicals and healthcare waste, then we deploy vehicles with separate storage compartments
- Our swap body vehicles ensure the waste is transported safely to the treatment plants
- Our vans make it easy for us to call at businesses located in pedestrianised areas or narrow streets


Flexible, thorough, reliable: Our collection service

Just as our waste management systems are drawn up to reflect your specific requirements, so too are our collection services. We swap full containers for empty ones, either singly or by the pallet. Costs are charged according to container or weight keeping everything transparent for you as our customer.

We take the term 'on-site collection' quite literally. Our trained specialists pick up the materials straight from the wards, examination rooms and laboratories. They also check that the lids have been placed on the bins correctly and that the right labels have been used. You can rest assured that we will help you out if there is a problem (e.g. using additional outer packaging).
